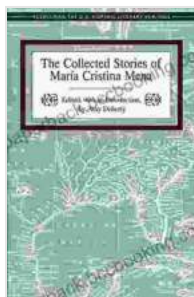

About the Author

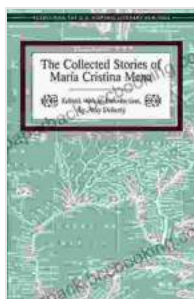
