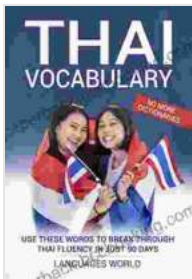

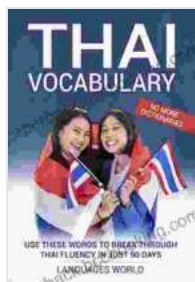

(chan choo ...) \* Where are you from? - คุณมาจากไหน (khun maa jak nai) \* I'm from ... - ฉันมาจาก ... (chan maa jak ...) \* What do you do? - คุณทำอะไร (khun tam arai) \* I'm a student - ฉันเป็นนักเรียน (chan pen nak-rian) \* I'm a teacher - ฉันเป็นครู (chan pen kruu) \* I'm a doctor - ฉันเป็นแพทย์ (chan pen maet-ai)



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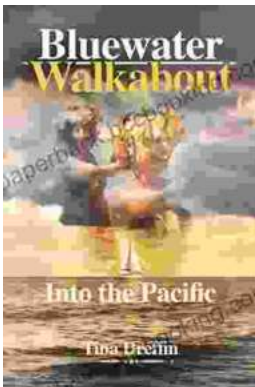
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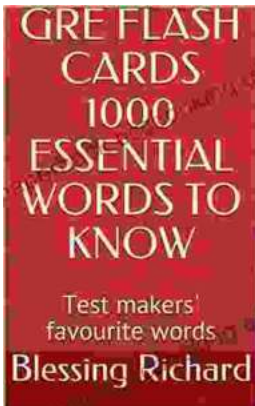
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
